This Request for Expression of Interest (EoI) follows the General Procurement Notice for this project which appeared in the DG Market of August 18<sup>th</sup> 2009 and New Vision and East African Publications of August 13<sup>th</sup> and August 17<sup>th</sup> 2009 respectively, and is open to all eligible bidders as defined in the World Banks' Guidelines for Selection and Employment of Consultants (current edition).

The Government of Uganda has secured financing from the World Bank towards support for the implementation of the Uganda Post-Primary Education and Training Project (UPPET) and wishes to apply some of the proceeds to financing the Consultancy Services to design and operationalize the Secondary Teacher Development and Management System (TDMS) for Uganda. The overall goal of TDMS-Secondary is to improve teacher quality and development for overall improvements in secondary school students' learning and competency levels.

TDMS- secondary is intended to enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning through; increased availability of well trained secondary school teachers; institutionalized in-service training of serving teachers, head teachers and education managers; enhanced support to Education Managers, School Managers and Administrators and, enhanced community participation in schools activities.

The principal objective of the assignment is to conceptualize and design TDMS-Secondary System that is capable of producing qualified teachers of desired training levels and quality in a cost effective manner on one hand, and a system of teacher development that is holistic, integrated, institutionalized and dynamic on the other. In order to achieve this, a consultancy input will be outsourced to assist the Teacher Education and Instructor department refine the TDMS-Secondary concept and design a relevant system for its operationalisation and delivery. The proposed system is envisaged to cover all Secondary Teacher Training Institutions (i.e. the National Teachers' Colleges and Universities) as well as serving teachers located in network of all Secondary schools (*both government aided and private*).

The Ministry of Education and Sports now invites eligible consultants to indicate their interest in providing the services. Interested Consultants must provide information indicating that they are qualified to perform the services (brochures, description of similar assignments, experience in similar conditions, availability of appropriate skills among staff, knowledge and working experience with public procurement and financial systems and procedures in Uganda and those of the World Bank, etc.). Consultants may associate to enhance their qualifications.

A consultant will be selected in accordance with the procedures set out in the World Bank's *Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants by World Bank's Borrowers (current edition)*.
