EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Introduction

This statistical abstract gives the state of the Education and Sports sector as of 2025. It describes the key indicators of access, equity and quality of education and sports in Uganda. This is done through compilation of data pertaining to: institution profiles, learner attributes, staff attributes, infrastructure and instructional materials across the different levels of education.

Revamped EMIS

In the year 2017, the Ministry halted the use of annual school census (ASC) due to the inherent challenges with data accuracy, consistency, questionnaire-fatigue and timeliness of the reports. This cessation of the ASC rendered the Ministry incapable of generating an annual statistical abstract for the education and sports sector for the past eight years (2018-2024).

In 2019, the Ministry in collaboration with the Ministry of ICT and National Guidance, initiated the process of revamping the Education Management Information System into a scalable web-based one stop center for management of information within the education and sports sector. This redeveloped system was rolled out in 2022.

This abstract was compiled using data drawn from the redeveloped EMIS for the academic year 2025.

Pre-primary Schools

Management of Pre-primary education is decentralised, implying oversight, licensing and registration of pre-primary institutions is conducted under the auspices of the local government.

Pre-primary education services are provided by private entities and as such, there are no public pre-primary schools.

- i. The total number of Pre-Primary schools registered on EMIS is 24,923.
- ii. A total of 7,408 pre-primary schools responded to the Education Management Information System, with a total enrolment of 592,049.
- iii. 592,049 learners were enrolled in pre-primary schools, with 286,470 (48.4%) female and 305,579 (51.6%) male learners.
- iv. Of the 592,049 pre-primary learners, 11,713 (2%) were learners with special needs.
- v. The total number of teachers is 18,790, translating to a PTR of 31:1.
- vi. A total of 12,000 classrooms was available to pre-primary learners, of which 9,119 (76%) were permanent and 2,881 (24%) temporary. This gives a PCR of 49:1.

Primary Schools

- i. The total number of primary schools in the country is 45,164. Of these, government schools are 12,544 and Private schools are 32,620
- ii. The total of primary schools which responded to the EMIS is 26,597 schools out of which 12,511 (47%) are government schools and 14,086 (53%) are private.
- iii. The enrolment for primary schools stands at 11,787,396 learners. 6,179,721 (52.4%) are male learners while 5,607,675 (47.6%) are female learners.
- iv. 9,087,144 (77.1%) of the primary school learners are enrolled in public schools while 2,700,252 (32.9%) learners are enrolled in private schools.
- v. 580,219 learners are categorized as SNE, of which 48.5% are female and 51.5% are male.
- vi. The total number of teachers in primary schools is 226,771, of which 149,182 (66%) were employed in public schools and 77,589 (34%) were employed in private schools.
- vii. The PTR of Government schools is 61:1 while the PTR of private schools is 35:1.
- viii. 115,384 (50.9%) of the teaching staff are female, while 111,387 (49.1%) are male.
- ix. The total number of 178,035 classrooms were recorded under the primary sector, of which 148,500 (83.4%) are permanent and 29,535 (16.6%) are temporary. Government schools recorded a higher number of classrooms totalling to 111,591 (62.7%), compared to their counterparts in private school that recorded 66,444 (37.3%) classrooms.
- x. The PCR of Government schools is 79:1 whereas the PCR of private schools is 38:1.
- xi. A total of 205,088 stances was recorded. The PSR for Government schools is 61:1 whereas the PSR for private schools is 36:1

Secondary schools

- i. The total number of secondary schools in the country is 7,466. Of these, government schools are 1,507 and Private schools are 5,959.
- ii. A total of 4,571 secondary schools responded to EMIS in the year 2025. Of these, 1,493 (32.7%) are government owned whereas 3,078 are privately owned (67.3%).
- iii. The total enrolment is 2,044,586 learners of which 51.6% were female learners and 48.4% were male.
- iv. 1,268,040 (62%) learners were enrolled in public schools while 776,546 (38%) were enrolled in private schools.
- v. 70.7% of the total enrolment was aged between 13 to 18 years, where 26.2% of the enrolment was over aged while 3.1% was under age.
- vi. 38,642 learners are categorized as SNE, of which 20,548(53.2%) were female and 18,094 (46.8%) male.

- vii. A total of 64,975 teachers are employed in the secondary subsector. Of these, 19,585 (30.1%) are female, while 45,390 (69.9%) are male. Teachers employed in Public schools totalled to 40,629 (62.5%), while those employed in private schools totalled to 24,346 (37.5%).
- viii. The STR of Government schools is 31:1 while that of private schools is 32:1
- ix. 22,294 classrooms of which 20,443(91.7%) was permanent and 1,851(8.3%) was temporary. The SCR of Government secondary schools is 75:1 while that of private schools is 46:1.
- x. A total of 42,654 latrine stances was recorded. The SSR of governments is 75:1 while that of private schools is 43:1.

Certificate Awarding Institutions

- i. The total number of certificate awarding institutions is 135, with 17 institutions privately owned and 118 institutions owned by government.
- ii. The total enrolment is 22,977 learners of which 20% are female learners and 80% male learners.
- iii. Total enrolment in Public institutions was 19,853 (86.4%) and 3,214(13.6%) in Private institutions.

Diploma Awarding Institutions

- i. The total number of diploma awarding institutions is 174; of which 109 were privately owned and 65 owned by government.
- ii. The total enrolment is 61,697 learners of which 46% are female learners and 54% are male learners
- iii. The academic workforce across institutions comprises 67% males and 37% females.
- iv. Fifty-eight percent (58%) of the academic workforce are full-time employees and the rest (42%) are engaged on part time basis.

Degree Awarding Institutions

- i. Uganda currently has a total of 73 degree awarding institutions, comprising 55 universities and 18 Other Degree Awarding Institutions (ODAs). Public universities totalled to 11 universities and 1 ODA, while the private universities totalled to 61.
- ii. The total enrolment is 227,127 of which (54.5%) are male and (45.5%) are female.
- iii. A total of 184,989 (81.5%) learners are enrolled in STEM programs whereas 42,138 (18.5%) learners are enrolled in humanities study programs

CHAPTER ONE: BACKGROUND

This chapter provides the foundational context for the 2025 Statistical Abstract of the Ministry of Education and Sports (MOES). It outlines the Ministry's Vision, Mission, Mandate, and Strategic Objectives, which guide the delivery of education and sports services in Uganda.

By presenting the institutional structures and governance arrangements through which the sector operates, the chapter establishes the policy and administrative framework within which sector performance is monitored and reported. It further highlights the planning, coordination, and evaluation mechanisms employed by MOES, which form the basis for generating reliable sector statistics.

This background is essential for interpreting the indicators, trends, and analyses presented in the 2025 Statistical Abstract. In doing so, the chapter links the Ministry's institutional functions to the data requirements necessary for evidence-based decision-making, thereby focusing the discussion on the core purpose of the abstract: to provide an authoritative statistical profile of the Education and Sports Sector in 2025

1.1 Vision, Mission Statement & Strategic Objectives

Vision: "Quality Education and Sports for All"

Mission Statement: "To provide for, support, guide, coordinate, regulate and promote delivery of quality Education and Sports to all persons in Uganda; for national integration, individual and national development.

Broad Priority Objectives:

To Make significant and permanent gains in achieving equitable access to education at all levels;

- (i) Improve considerably the quality of education, particularly at primary level;
- (ii) Enhance the management of education and sports service delivery at all levels particularly at district level; and,
- (iii) Develop the capacity of Local Governments by helping Education Managers acquire and improve on their knowledge, skills and attitudes to be able to plan, monitor, account and perform managerial functions.

Strategic Objectives:

- (i) Achieve Equitable Access to Education and Training;
- (ii) Ensure delivery of relevant and quality Education and Training; and,
- (iii) Enhance efficiency and effectiveness of Education and Sports service delivery at all levels.

1.2 Mandate and Functions

The mandate of the Ministry of Education and Sports is to oversee the development and regulation of education and sports across the country. This entails:

- i. Developing, monitoring and assessing national policies for the education sector;
- ii. Planning for the overall development of the sector;
- iii. Providing technical guidance and co-ordination;
- iv. Establishing national standards;
- v. Carrying out Monitoring and Evaluation;
- vi. Inspection and regulation;
- vii. Offering Mentorship

To fulfil this mandate, the Ministry undertakes the following major functions:

- i. Providing technical, material and financial support for effective delivery of education services;
- ii. Provision of mechanisms and framework for admission of learners to educational institutions;
- iii. Delivering Career Guidance and Counselling to educational institutions;
- iv. Coordinating training programmes for teachers and tutors;
- v. Managing national and international scholarships and bursaries;
- vi. Collecting, organizing and analyzing educational information and data to support planning, decision making and policy development.
- vii. Designing and reviewing the Education strategic plan and developing an input/outcome-based Sector Medium Term Budget Framework;
- viii. Establishing, monitoring, analyzing, and reviewing policies within the Sector;
- ix. Setting, disseminating, monitoring and evaluating minimum national education standards;
- x. Guiding, monitoring and evaluating development of curricula and publications for educational institutions;
- xi. Setting, administering and marking national examinations;
- xii. Appointing and sensitizing Boards of Governors for educational institutions;
- xiii. Promoting sports development throughout the country; and;
- xiv. Appointing, deploying, promoting and disciplining teachers in Post- Primary Institutions.

CHAPTER TWO: THE EDUCATION MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

This chapter highlights the progress of the Education Management Information System (EMIS).

2.1 Introduction.

The Ministry of Education and Sports (MoES) initiated the development of the Education Management Information System (EMIS) in 1999. Although the system had existed for nearly two decades, it faced major challenges including heavy dependence on donor support, lack of a sustainability strategy, abandonment by the software supplier, outdated technology, absence of system source code and documentation, and the absence of capacity for Application programming Interface (API) with other relevant information management systems.

The old EMIS mainly relied on the Annual School Census approach, which involved distribution of hard-copy questionnaires to schools, which collected aggregated data rather than individual level information. Moreover, the manual transmission and entry of data caused persistent concerns regarding data accuracy, timeliness, and consistency.

To address these weaknesses, MoES discontinued the Annual School Census in 2017 and signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Ministry of ICT & National Guidance to support the design, redevelopment, and commissioning of the redeveloped EMIS.

2.2 The Re-Developed Education Management and Information System (EMIS)

The new EMIS is a web-based, robust one-stop centre for reliable and timely data management for the Education and Sports Sector. EMIS supports planning, budgeting, monitoring and evaluation, evidence-based decision-making, and satisfies various requirements of local, regional, and international reporting frameworks.

Objective of Education Management Information System (EMIS).



The purpose of the Education Management Information System (EMIS) is “To provide a fully functional, integrated and reliable EMIS system that enables collection, storage, processing, analysis, and dissemination of information for policy development, planning, resource allocation and effective management of education service.

The EMIS is built around three Pillars namely; (i) **the People pillar** – which (ii) **the Practices/Procedures pillar** constituting of sector policies, rules & regulations, institution arrangements, practices, guidelines, concepts, processes and service delivery standards and; (ii) **the Technology pillar** comprising software and hardware

for statistical operations, information sharing (between suppliers, producers and users), reporting and information dissemination.

In November 2022, the EMIS was rolled out to all Local Governments and subsequently to all education institutions across the country. The system is used to collect and analyse data on various aspects of the Ministry of education and sports sector, such as learner enrolment, infrastructure, P.E and Sports, teachers, licenses and registration certificates.

The EMIS has different users that operate at different levels. These include:

- i. MoES administrator users,
- ii. Local Government official users (DEO/MEO/CEO/DIS/CAO),
- iii. Lower Local Government officer users,
- iv. Heads of education institution users for education institutions of all levels, and
- v. The general public

Key new features of the system include learner management for individual learner-level data collection, introduction of the Learner Identification Number (LIN), human resources management, learner and teacher transfer tracking and traceability, on line licensing and registration of education institutions, infrastructure management, and Physical Education (P.E) and sports management. The system is also integrated with other data management systems, to wit: the NIRA system for verification of identification details of nationals, the Uganda National Examination Board (UNEBC) for index number validation, among others.

CHAPTER THREE: THE PREPRIMARY SUB SECTOR

This chapter highlights statistics of the Pre-primary sub sector categorized by institutional statistics, enrolment, human resource, infrastructure and sanitation facilities.

3.1 Institutional Statistics

3.1.1. Pre-Primary schools by Region

A total of 7,408 pre-primary schools responded to the Education Management Information System. Central region hosts the highest number of pre-primary schools, totalling to 4,002 (54.02%) followed by Western region with 1,671 (22.5%) schools, Eastern region with 937 (12.65%) schools and lastly the Northern region with 798 (10.77%) schools.

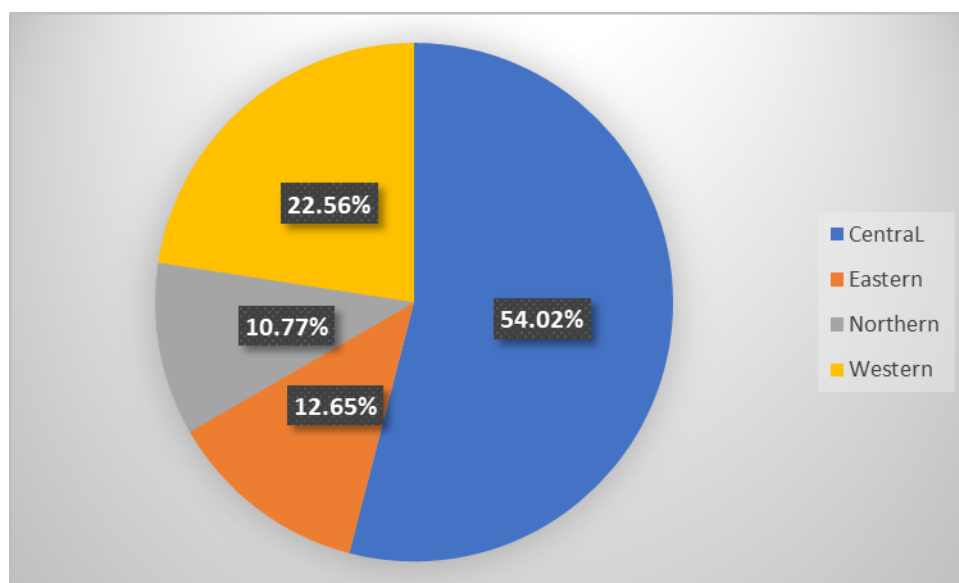


Figure 3. 1 Regional Distribution of Pre-primary schools

3.2 Enrolment in Pre-Primary School

3.2.1 Enrolment by Age and Sex

As of December 2025, the pre-primary sector enrolment totalled to 592,049 learners. Of these, female learners totalled to 286,470 (48.4%) while male learners totalled to 305,579 (51.6%).

Top Class had the highest number of learners, amounting to 206,752 (34.9%), followed by Baby class with 190,850 (32.2%) learners, Middle class with 184,510 (31.2%) learners and lastly Daycare with 9,937 (1.7%) learners as detailed in the Table 3.3 Below.

CHAPTER FOUR: PRIMARY SUB SECTOR

Since the introduction of the UPE Policy in 1997, the government has steadily increased investment in primary education through the construction of new schools using the Schools Facilities Grant scheme as well as provision of grant aid to community schools and private primary schools. This chapter provides the key primary findings from the schools which responded to the EMIS system data upload exercise about the status and developments in the primary sub sector. These include: school information, enrolments, infrastructure, sanitation facilities, and Sports among others.

4.1 Institutional statistics

4.1.1 Primary schools by Ownership and region

A total of 26,597 primary schools responded to the Education Management Information System. The central region hosts the highest number of primary schools, totalling to 10,078 (38%) followed by the Western region with 7,188 (27%), Eastern region with 5,897 (22%) schools, and lastly the Northern region with 3,434 (13%) schools.

4.1.2 Primary schools by Ownership and Sub-region

A total of 26,597 primary schools responded to EMIS in the year 2025. Of these, 12,511 (47%) are government owned whereas 14,086 (53%) are privately owned. 4.2 Learner Enrolment in Primary schools

Figure showing the Trend analysis of Government Primary Schools, 2022-2025

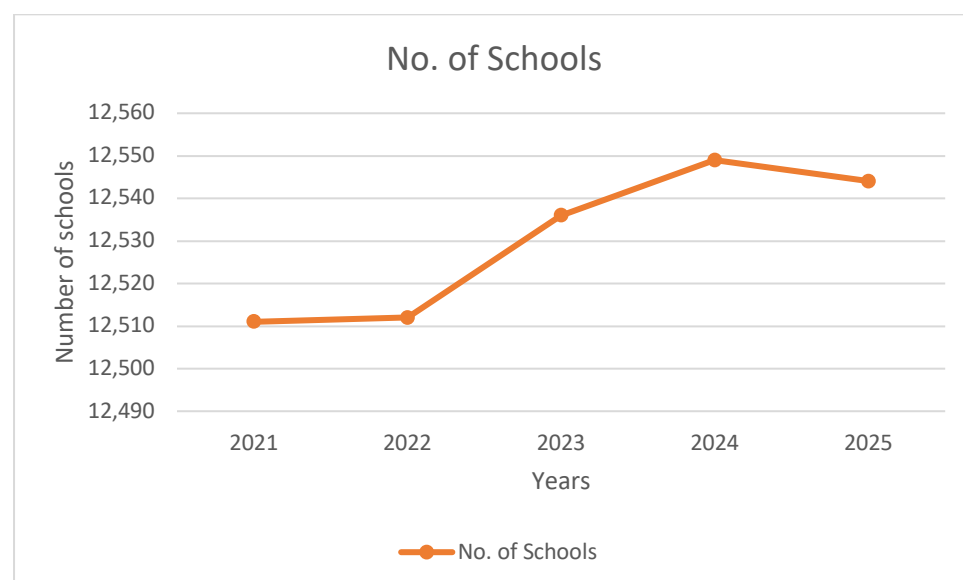


Figure 4. 1 Trend Analysis of Government Primary Schools, 2022-2025

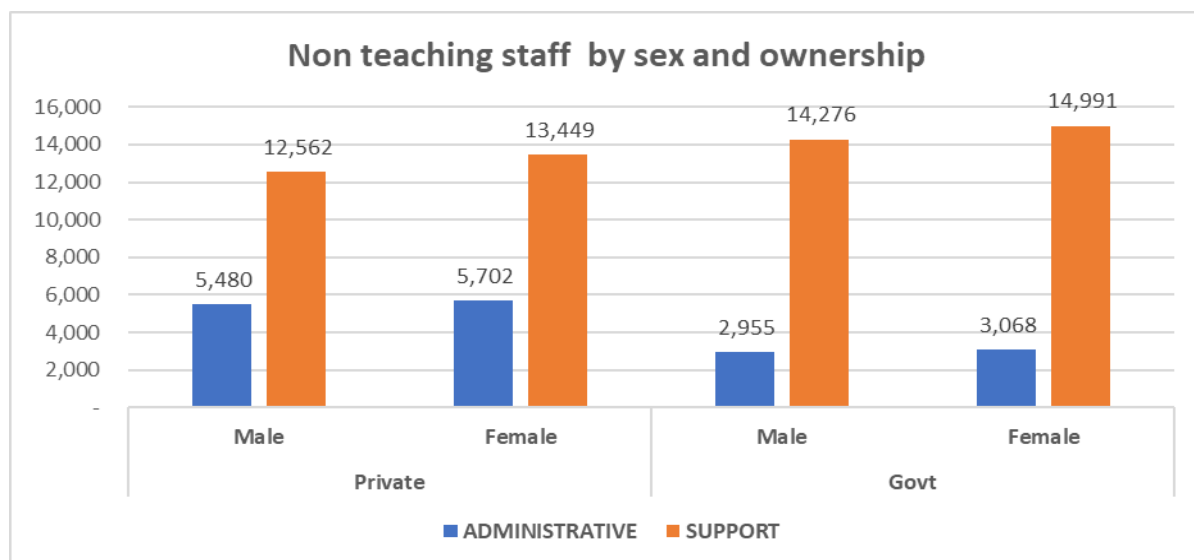


Figure 4. 2 Non-teaching staff by sex and ownership

CHAPTER FIVE: SECONDARY SUB-SECTOR

5.0 Introduction

This chapter provides the statistics pertaining to the state of secondary education in Uganda. These include: school profiles, enrolments, infrastructure, sanitation facilities, and Sports among others.

5.1 Institutional statistics

5.1.1 Secondary schools by ownership and region

A total of 4,571 secondary schools responded to EMIS in the year 2025. The Central region hosts the highest number of secondary schools totalling to 1,768 (38.56%) followed by the Eastern region with 1,275 (28%), Western region 1,026 (22%) and lastly Northern region with 502 (11%).

5.1.2 Distribution of Secondary schools by Sub region

A total of 4,571 secondary schools responded to EMIS in the year 2025. Of these, 1,493 (32.7%) are government owned whereas 3,078 are privately owned (67.3%). 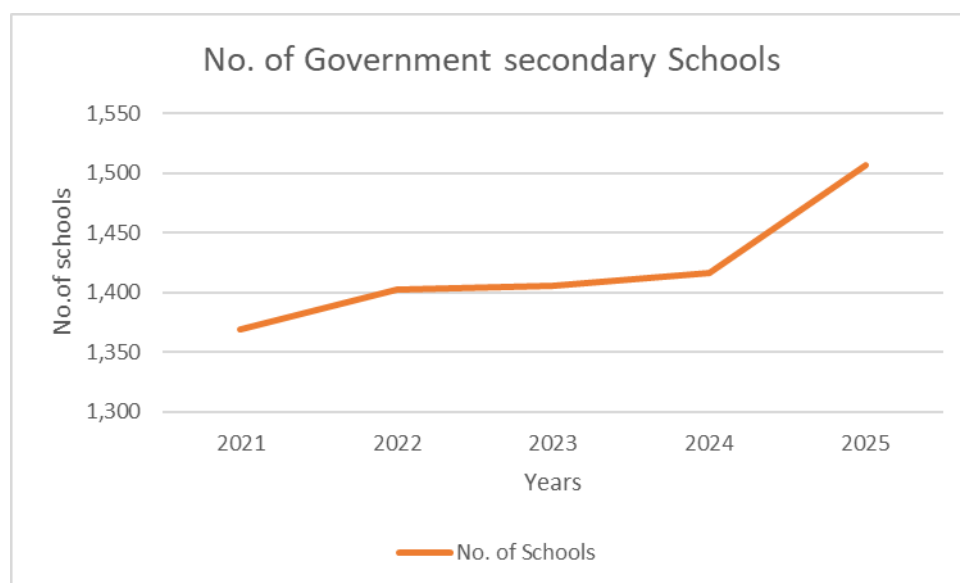


Figure 5. 1 Trend of government Secondary schools (2021-2025)

5.2 Learner enrolment in Secondary schools

5.2.1 Enrolment by Grade, Age and Sex

In Uganda, secondary education has six (6) grades/classes with the minimum age of entry to grade/class one (1) being 13 years and the maximum age of exit from grade/class six (6) being 18 years.

Findings indicate that the total enrolment of secondary school students stands at 2,044,586. Of these, male students are 989,567(48.4%) while Female students are 1,055,019 (51.6%).

Of the total enrolment, 70.7% of the students are aged between 13 to 18 years, 26.2% are 19 years and above while 3.1% are below 13 years. Details are provided in Table 5.4 below.

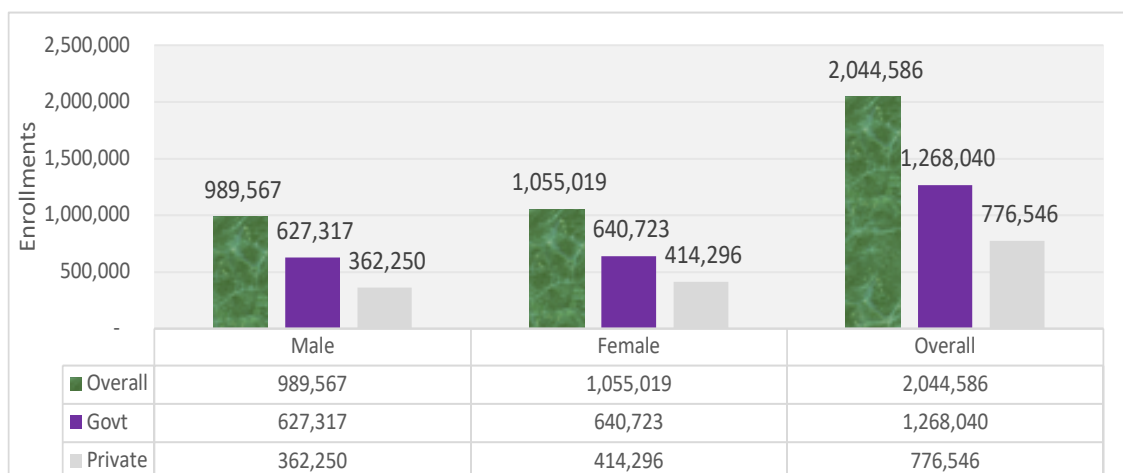


Figure 5.1 Enrolment by ownership

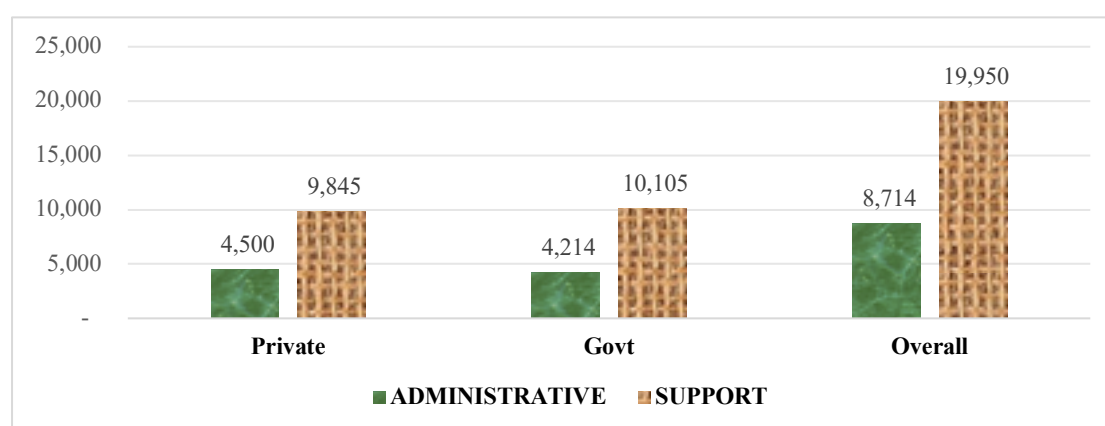


Figure 5. 2 Non-teaching staff by category

6.0 Introduction

This chapter provides statistics pertaining to certificate awarding institutions in Uganda. These include: Institution location, ownership status, enrolments and infrastructure.

6.1 Institutional Statistics

6.1.1 Certificate Awarding Institutions by Ownership

The data below shows that there is a total of 135 institutions, with 17 private and 118 public. Of these, Technical Schools account for 26 institutions (1 private and 25 public), Community Polytechnics make up 31 institutions (16 private and 15 public), while Technical Institutions are entirely public, totalling 78.

Overall, public institutions dominate across the country representing higher numbers compared to private institutions.

6.1.2 Institutions by geographical location

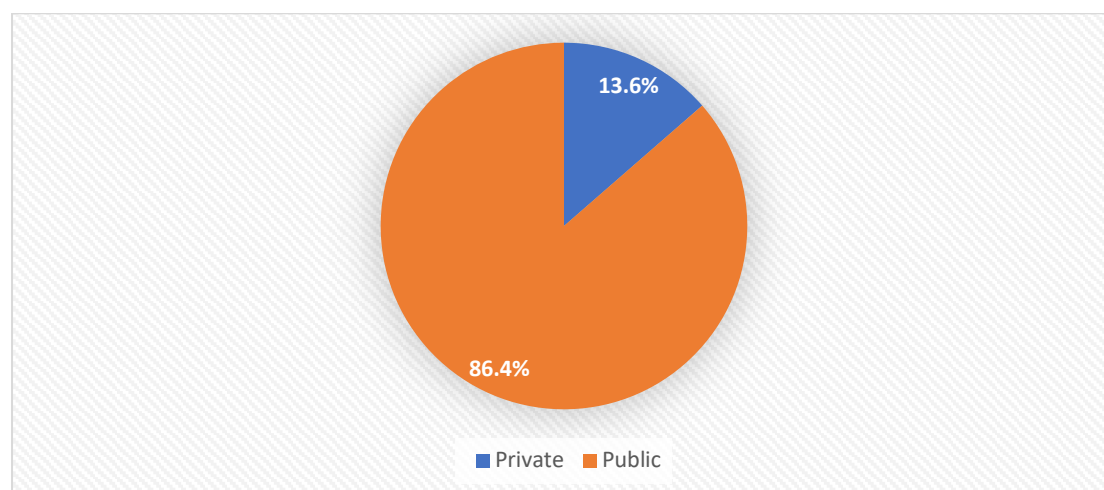


Figure 6. 1 Enrolment by Ownership

The findings indicate that public institutions have considerably more infrastructure than private institutions.

Public institutions have comparatively higher numbers of class rooms (796), libraries (32), latrines (1,291) and laboratories (304) than the private institutions nationwide.

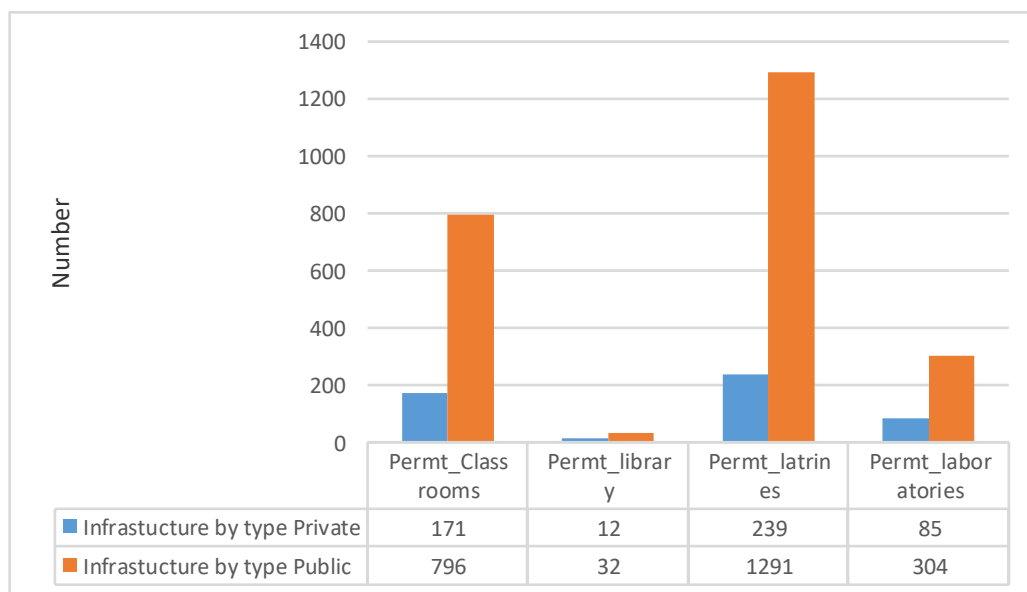


Figure 6. 2 infrastructure by building type

CHAPTER SEVEN: DIPLOMA AWARDING INSTITUTIONS

7.0 Introduction

This chapter provides statistics pertaining to diploma awarding institutions in Uganda. The variables considered include: Ownership, location, learner-enrolment, staff and infrastructure.

7.1 Diploma Awarding Institutional Statistics

7.1.1 Diploma Awarding Institutions by Ownership

The Table 7.1 below shows that there are more private diploma awarding institutions (109) than public ones (65). More private institutions offer training in Commercial, Social Development whereas Science & Technology, and the public institutions mainly offer training in technical fields and teacher training.

7.1.2 Regional Distribution of Institutions by category.

The regional distribution of diploma-awarding institutions in table 7.2 below, shows a total of 174, with the Central region hosting the majority (84), followed by the Northern (30), Eastern (29), and Western (31) regions. It was observed that private institutions are concentrated in the Central region, whereas public institutions are more evenly spread across the regions.

7.2 Teaching and Non-teaching staff

7.2.1 Academic staff by highest level of qualification

Academic staff qualifications across diploma-awarding institutions show a total of 79 male PhDs and 11 female PhDs, with the majority holding Master's degrees (656 males, 284 females) and Bachelor's degrees (1,335 males, 648 females). The largest concentration of staff is in Commercial, Social Development, Science & Technology Colleges and Health Science Institutions, which together account for most of the Master's and Bachelor's holders. Overall, while PhD holders remain few, the workforce is dominated by staff with Master's and Bachelor's qualifications, with males consistently outnumbering females across all levels.

7.4 Students Instructional materials

The distribution of instructional materials in diploma-awarding institutions in Uganda shows that private institutions collectively provide more textbooks (250,001) than public ones (140,707), with the Bible/Theological Colleges contributing the largest share among private institutions (125,082). Commercial, Social Development, Science & Technology colleges also stand out with significant private allocations (74,696), while Health Science institutions have substantial contributions from both private (38,548) and public (26,504) sides.

7.5 Computer Access

Computer access in diploma-awarding institutions totals 5,158 student's computers, 1,480 staff computers, 1,124 shared computers, and 4,074 internet connections, with private institutions providing the majority of student computers (2,957) and internet connections (2,364), mainly through Commercial/Science & Technology and Health Science Colleges. Public institutions contribute 2,201 student computers and 1,710 internet connections, led by National Teacher Colleges and Technical/Survey & Land Management Colleges. Overall, private institutions dominate student access in commercial and health fields, while public institutions focus on teacher training and technical education, showing complementary strengths in digital infrastructure.

7.6 Access to Infrastructure

Access to infrastructure in diploma-awarding institutions totals 68,643 chairs and 20,738 tables, with private institutions providing 42,468 chairs and 10,540 tables, while public institutions contribute 26,175 chairs and 10,198 tables. The largest provisions are found in Commercial, Social Development, Science & Technology Colleges (24,589 chairs and 8,766 tables) and Health Science Institutions (19,171 chairs and 2,723 tables), together accounting for the bulk of resources. Public institutions dominate in National Teacher Colleges (7,749 chairs and 3,627 tables) and technical colleges, while private institutions lead in theological and commercial categories. Overall, infrastructure distribution highlights strong capacity in science, health, and teacher training institutions, with private institutions supplying more seating and public institutions contributing significantly in education-focused categories.

CHAPTER EIGHT: INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING- UNIVERSITIES AND OTHER DEGREE AWARDING INSTITUTIONS

8.0 Introduction

This chapter presents the state of Uganda's higher learning- education system. Uganda's higher learning is provided by a blend of public and private universities and Other Degree Awarding (ODA) institutions¹. Statistics are provided on ownership, type of institution, enrolment, staff attributes and infrastructure available in these institutions.

8.1 Institutional Statistics

8.1.1 Institution by Ownership and Type of Institution

The data in table 8.1, shows that across all regions there are a total of 73 institutions, comprising 55 universities and 18 Other Degree Awarding Institutions (ODAs). Public ownership accounts for 11 universities and 1 ODA, while private ownership dominates with 44 universities and 17 ODAs. Regionally, the Central region has the largest share with 48 institutions (31 universities and 17 ODAs), followed by the Western region with 13 universities, the Northern region with 6 universities, and the Eastern region with 6 institutions (5 universities and 1 ODA). Overall, private institutions significantly outnumber public ones, and the Central region stands out as the hub for provision of higher education.

8.2 Student Enrolment in Institutions of Higher learning

8.2.1 Enrolment by Type of discipline and sex

The enrolment data shows that universities have the largest share of students, with 92,115 males and 81,756 females in sciences, and 25,744 males and 15,183 females in humanities. Other Degree Awarding Institutions (ODAs) contribute smaller numbers, enrolling 5,284 males and 5,834 females in sciences, and 676 males and 535 females in humanities. Overall, across both universities and ODAs, sciences attract more students than humanities, with a total of 97,399 males and 87,590 females in sciences compared to 26,420 males and 15,718 females in humanities, indicating both a gender gap and a stronger preference for science disciplines.

8.2.2 Enrolment by nationality

The enrolment data shows that nationally, male students (60,048) slightly outnumber female students (51,070), while foreign enrolment is much lower, with 8,199 males and 3,680 females in private institutions and 622 males and 458 females in public institutions. Overall, the grand total indicates 115,122 national students compared to 13,000 foreign students.

8.3 Teaching and non-teaching staff in Institutions of Higher learning

The data shows that in both private and public institutions, academic staff are predominantly holders of master's degrees, with private institutions employing the largest share (2,688 males and 1,417 females). PhD holders are fewer but still significant, with private institutions having slightly more (989 males and 250 females) compared to public ones (961 males and 288 females).

8.3.1 Teachers by sex and Qualification

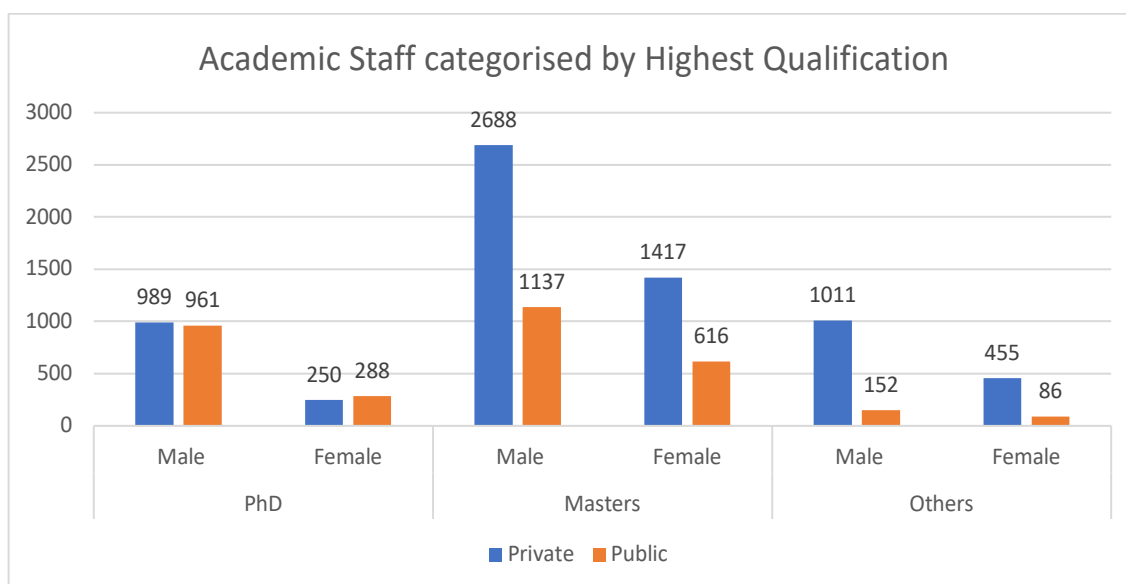


Figure 8. 1 Academic Staff categorised by highest Qualification

8.3.2 Academic staff categorized by type and level of engagement

The data shows that universities employ a significant number of academic staffs across private and public institutions, with notable differences by gender and level of engagement. In private universities, full-time staff total 4,985, comprising 3,436 males and 1,549 females, while public universities have 3,459 full-time staff, with 2,334 males and 1,125 females. For part-time staff, private universities employ 3,292 individuals (2,251 males and 1,041 females), compared to 915 in public universities (627 males and 288 females). Overall, private universities have higher staff numbers than public ones, and across both sectors, male staff outnumber female staff in both full-time and part-time roles.

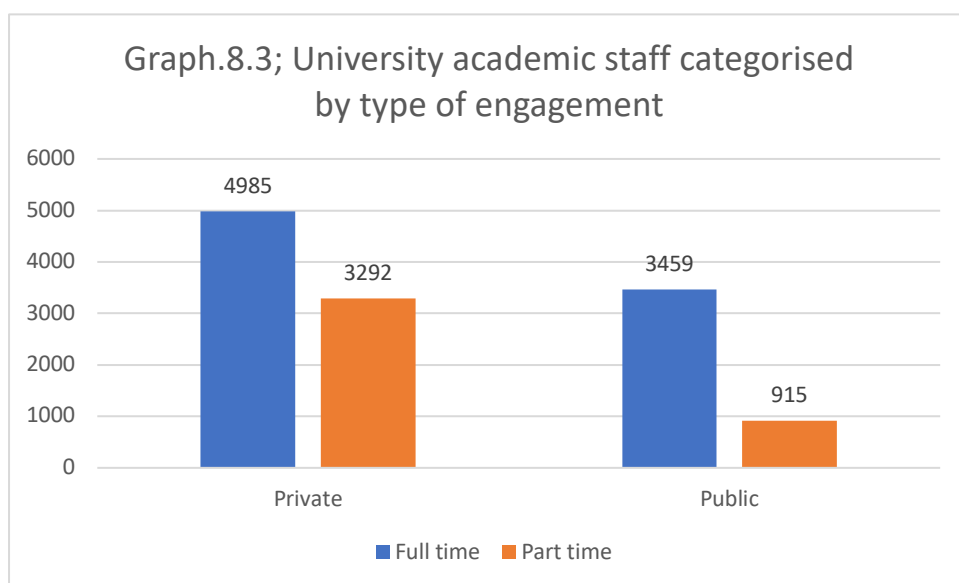


Figure 8. 2 University academic staff categorized by type of engagement

8.3.3 Non-academic staff categorized by sex and role (administrative/support)

Findings indicate that the non-administrative staff totalled to 6,782. Of which Administrative staff are 3, 327 while support staff are 3,455. In addition, it is observed that male dominate both categories of non-academic staff.

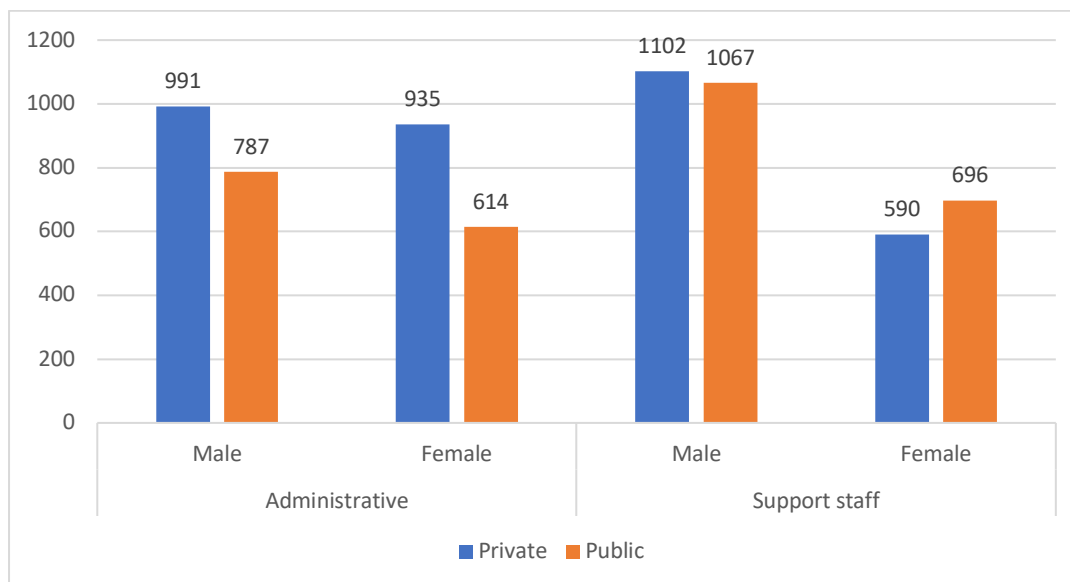


Figure 8. 3 Non-academic staff by level of engagement

CHAPTER NINE: ANALYSIS OF PERFORMANCE FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2024 NATIONAL EXAMINATIONS

9.0 Introduction

This chapter highlights the performance of learners/ students in the national examinations for the year 2024. The narrative is broken down into the different examinations that apply to the different levels of education; that is Primary Leaving Examinations for Primary, Uganda Certificate of Education for Ordinary level and Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education for Advanced level.

9.1 Learners Performance by Level.

9.1.1 Primary Leaving Examinations -2024

A total of 793,719 learners registered for the Primary Leaving Examinations in the academic year 2024. Of the registered learners, 783,297(99%) were able to sit for the examinations, while 10,422(1%) were reported to be absent.

A further analysis of the performance indicates that Division 2 emerged with the highest number of learners, totalling to 395,308 (49.8%), followed by Division 3 with 164,733 (20.8%), while Division 1 emerged with 83,697 (10.5%) as detailed in Table 9.1 below

9.1.2 Uganda Certificate of Examination (UCE 2024)

A total of 358,838 learners registered for the Uganda Certificate of Examinations in the academic year 2024. Of the registered learners, 357,158(99.5%) were able to sit for the examinations, while 1,680 (0.5%) were reported to be absent.

Result 1 emerged with the highest number of learners, totaling to 356,887 (99.5%), while Result 3 emerged with 265 (0.1%), whereas only 6 learners were ungraded, as detailed in Table 9.2 below

9.1.3 Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE 2024)

A total of 141,799 learners registered for the Uganda Advanced Certificate of Examinations in the academic year 2024. Of the registered learners, 140,694 (99.2%) were able to sit for the examinations, while 1,105 (0.5%) were reported to be absent.

139,349 (98.3%) of the learners were graded with result code 5, while 147 learners were graded with result code 7. A total of 1,198 learners that sat the examinations learners were ungraded whereas 1,105 were recorded absent, as detailed in Table 9.3 below

CHAPTER TEN: LEARNER ACHIEVEMENT IN NUMERACY AND LITERACY IN ENGLISH.

This section highlights learner achievement in numeracy and literacy in English for learners in lower primary (P.3) and upper primary (P.6).

10.1 Overall Level of achievement of P 3 learners in Numeracy and Literacy in English, by Sex

This section presents the performance of P 3 learners in Numeracy and literacy in English as detailed in Table 9.7 below. At national level, 57.5% of P3 learners were rated proficient in numeracy and 53.9% in literacy in English.

The proportion of girls (57.4%) rated proficient in English was higher than that of boys (50.6%) by 7.1%.

In contrast, the proportion of boys rated proficient in Numeracy was equal to that of girls, with both standing at 57.5%.

10.2 Overall level of achievement of P6 learners in Numeracy and Literacy in English, by sex.

This section presents the performance of P 6 learners in Numeracy and literacy in English as detailed in Table 9.7 below. At National level, 58% of the P3 learners were rated proficient in numeracy while 42.7% were rated proficient in literacy in English.

The proportion of boys (61.8%) rated proficient in numeracy was higher than that for girls (54.7%). Conversely, a higher proportion of girls (44.9%) were rated proficient in Literacy in English compared to boys (40.1%).

10.3 Trend analysis of P 3 learners rated proficient in numeracy and literacy in English from 2011 to 2023.

In this section a presentation of the performance pattern of P 3 pupils in numeracy and Literacy in English from 2011 to 2023. In P 3 class, the proportion of learners proficient in P3 Numeracy increased from 63% in 2011 to 72.7% in 2014 and remained relatively high in 2015 at 71.7%. However, proficiency decreased to 55.2% in 2018 and by 2023, it had increased to 57.5%.

The Proficiency in Literacy in English increased from 47.9% in 2011 to a high of 64.2% in 2014, with performance still relatively high at 60.2% in 2015. A decline followed, with proficiency decreasing to 49.9% in 2018 and by 2023, the proficiency had increased to 53.9%.

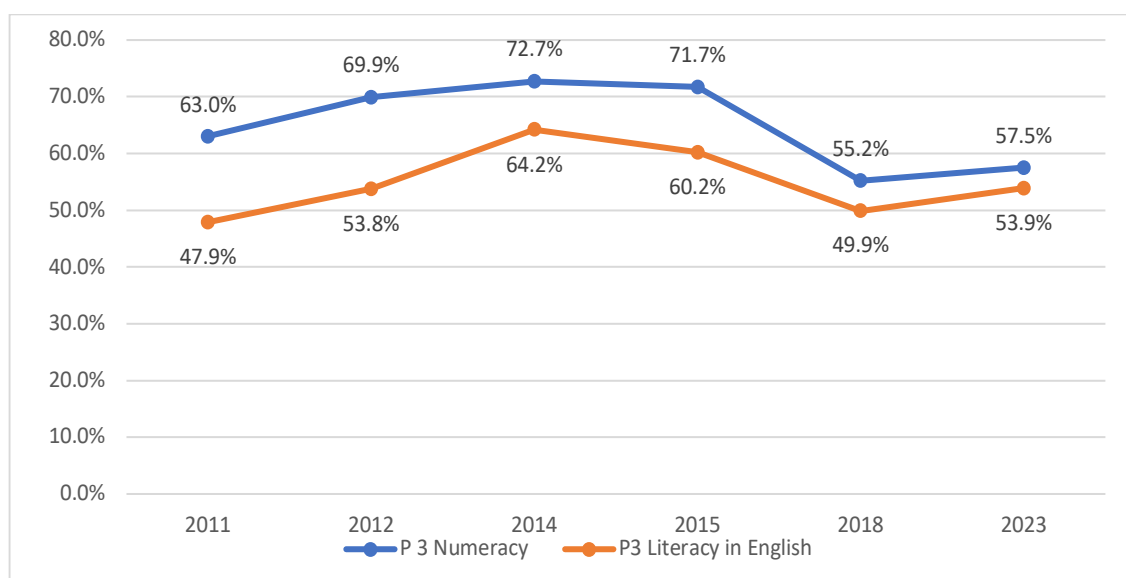


Figure 10. 1 Proportion of P 3 Learners Rated Proficient in Numeracy and Literacy

10.4 Trend analysis of P 6 learners rated proficient in Numeracy and Literacy in English from 2011 to 2023

This section presents the performance pattern of P 6 learners in Literacy in English and numeracy from 2011 to 2023. The results in the figure below indicate that at P 6 class; the proportion of P6 learners proficient in Numeracy decreased from 45.6% in 2011 to 39.4% in 2014 with an increase to 52.6% in 2015. By 2023, proficiency further increased to 58.0%, marking the highest achievement in the entire period.

The proportion of P6 learners proficient in Literacy in English decreased from 41.3% in 2011 to 38.3% in 2015 but later increased to 52.6% in 2015. However, between 2018 and 2023, the proficiency decreased from 50.9% to 42.7%.

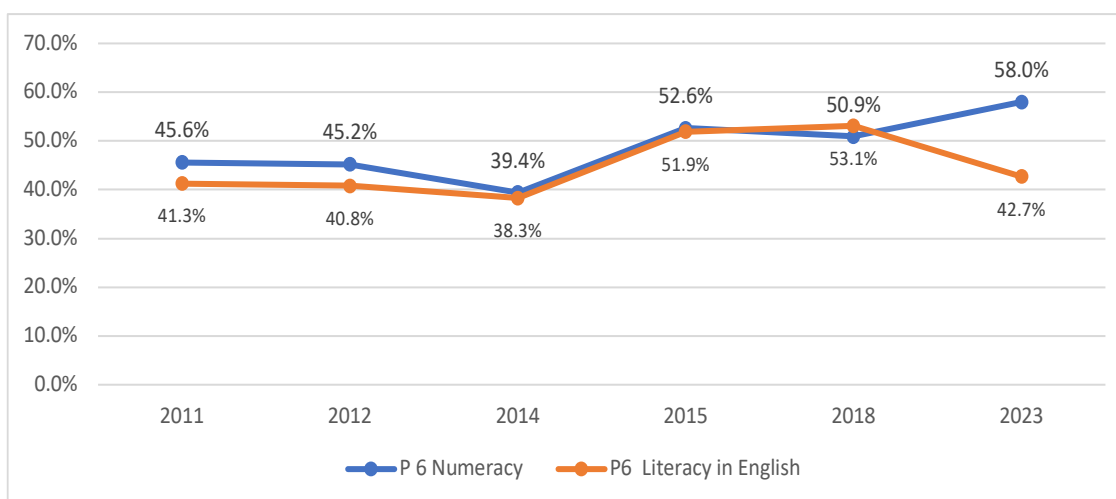


Figure 10. 2 Proportion of P 6 Learners Rated Proficient in Numeracy and Literacy
